Without experiencing this (job loss), I would have never known that there are several MCA-EC members who run consulting business, I would have never known that there are several members who are very influential in their firms, I would have never known that several MCA-EC members are so close to God that their prayers are on God's priority line. In fact, one MCA-EC member told me that her youngest son has always remembered to pray during their evening rosary for Mark uncle, that's me. I feel so lucky and special that I am part of MCA-EC family, where prayers always take center stage.

As I conclude this short testimony, I do not want to embarrass anyone by putting dozens of names here who helped me in September to find a new job. You know who you are and I really appreciate your help. 1) My mom filling up two gigantic stainless steel containers with homemade chakli, kare kadiyo, and kuswar (which would inevitably be eaten in its entirety by the first of January :-), 2) My dad, mom and sisters reviewing our address book as we sat together to write Christmas cards to all our family and friends, 3) Fighting yawns and exhaustion to stay up Christmas evening to attend midnight Mass, 4) Seeing the crib at the back of church, with all of the hay and Nativity statues, and having my dad fondly remember the crib competitions that he would eagerly enter as a child. Certainly, my personal meaning of Christmas was a combination of East Meets West. Yet, in spite of the dichotomies, family was always the common denominator, and at the heart of the story of Christmas is not only the birth of Baby Jesus, but also, the birth of our faith's first Holy Family. In this respect, regardless of the differences in the way we each may celebrate Christmas, as long as family is kept at the forefront, the true meaning of Christmas remains intact.

NOSTALGIA



The joy of Christmas continued until New Year's day.


